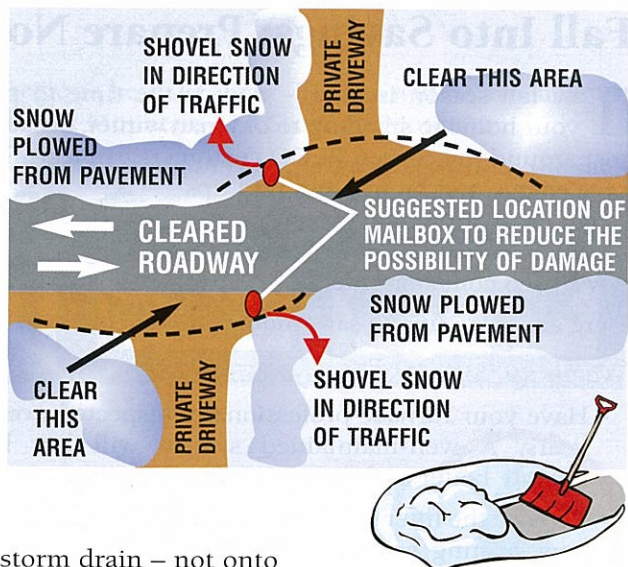


Winter Weather Reminders

Snow Specifics

Help us keep the township safe during a snowfall by observing these regulations:

- * Clear your sidewalks within 10 hours of the end of a snowfall. If snow falls after 6 p.m. you have until 11 a.m. the next day to salt and shovel.
- * Please park all vehicles off the street to allow for safe and efficient removal of snow from curb to curb. Also, please remove trashcans and sports equipment from the street.
- * Shovel snow to the right of your driveway, as you are facing the road. (See diagram) Shoveling or plowing snow onto a street or road is prohibited.
- * Be sure your sump pump discharges onto your land or into a storm drain – not onto sidewalks or streets, where it can freeze.
- * Please help the Fire Department by keeping fire hydrants clear of any snow from the storm and after a snowplow passes through your road. This is a very critical function that you can do to help save the firefighters valuable time in the event of a fire in your neighborhood or even your own home.

Driving in Winter Weather

The Partnership TMA, a region transportation planning organization, offers the following tips for being prepared to drive in harsh winter weather:

- * Do not park vehicles along snow emergency routes.
- * Be sure your vehicle is properly winterized with a full tank of gas, sufficient tread on tires, a clean windshield, and properly working headlights and brake lights.
- * Carry an emergency kit that includes a heavy blanket, salt or sand, water and non-perishable food.
- * If you are at work and it starts to snow, stay there. Don't try to beat the traffic. Give road crews a chance to plow and salt before you hit the road.
- * If you use SEPTA, visit www.septa.org for information about schedule changes, delays, detours or cancellations.
- * Always wear your seat belt, turn on your headlights and reduce your speed.
- * Take special precautions on roads that look wet but are actually frozen, often referred to as "black ice."
- * If you become stranded, do not leave your vehicle. Instead, keep a downwind window cracked, run the engine every half hour, and wait for help to arrive.
- * If you begin to skid, don't panic. Take your foot off the gas and don't hit the brakes. Turn your wheel into the direction of the skid and do not brake until you vehicle is traveling in a straight line.
