WHERE AS, Section 5 of the act of January 24 1966, P.L. 1535, No. 537 known as the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act, as amended, and the Rules and Regulations of the Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) adopted thereunder, Chapter 71 of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania Code, requires the Municipality to adopt an Official Sewage Facilities Plan (Facilities Plan), providing for sewage services adequate to prevent contamination of water and/or environmental health hazards with sewage waste, and to revise said plan whenever it is necessary to meet the sewage disposal needs of the municipality; and

WHERE AS, Towamencin Township has prepared an "Act 537 Special Study Acquisition of Towamencin Township / Towamencin Municipal Authority Sewage Facilities by Pennsylvania-American Water Company (PAWC)" Dated April 2023, last revised June 2023, which provides for the acquisition of the Towamencin Township sewage facilities by PAWC: and

WHERE AS, portions of Lower Salford Township are served by the Township sewage facilities, and

WHERE AS, the Act 537 Special Study was developed to address the Department's planning requirements for the acquisition of public sewerage system to a private entity, PAWC., with PAWC becoming the owner and operator of all sewage facility assets as described in the Plan. Topics covered include previous wastewater planning, description and graphical mapping of the existing assets being transferred in relation to municipal boundaries and physical characteristics, future growth and how that will be addressed, evaluation of alternatives, institutional evaluation and a description of the legal and administrative activities to support the implementation of the asset transfer and future ongoing operation and maintenance of the transferred assets, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lower Salford Township has found the Act 537 Special Study adequate for the wastewater disposal and management needs of the municipality and hereby adopts the Plan, as a revision of the "Official Plan" of the Municipality. The Municipality hereby assures the Department of the proper and timely implementation of the said plan as set forth herein.

WHEREAS, as a part of the Development, Grantor constructed Grayson Lane, Theodore Circle and an extension to Windsor Drive and other related improvements on the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Grantor, for and in consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00), desires to dedicate to Lower Salford Township ("Grantee") for public use and enjoyment the roads to the ultimate right-of-way of the Windsor Drive Extension, Grayson Lane and Theodore Circle located on the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Grantee, by accepting the Deeds of Dedication and recording said Deeds and this Resolution, accepts the parcels of ground, more particularly described in Exhibits "A", "B", and "C" and attached hereto and made a part hereof, as and for a public street, road, highway, trail, sidewalk, or utilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lower Salford Township Board of Supervisors accepts the Deeds of Dedication for the described property to have and to hold, forever, as for public streets, roads, highways, trails, sidewalks, or utilities, and with the same effect as if the same had been opened by a Decree of Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Montgomery after proceedings duly had for that purpose under and in pursuance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. On behalf of Montgomery County Consortium of Communities, Upper Merion Township solicited bids for the purchase of gasoline, both 87 & 93 Octane, and diesel fuel for municipal operations through PennBID. The Township, which includes the golf course and Community Center, typically orders approximately 35,000 gallons of 87 Octane gasoline and approximately 18,000 gallons of diesel fuel.

This contract is bid, and awarded, based on a differential of the price bid versus an established index price for a given date for each commodity. I've attached both the Recommendation of Award and the Notice of Contract Award from Upper Merion Township for your use. As you can see from these documents, the low bidder and awarded supplier for this contract is Petroleum Traders Corporation with the price differentials listed below.

FUEL CONTRACT

1. On behalf of the Montgomery County Consortium of Communities, Upper Merion Township received sealed bids online for the 2023-2024 Montgomery County Consortium Fuel Contract on May 26, 2023. Two vendors submitted bids: Petroleum Traders Corporation (PTC) of Fort Wayne, IN and Riggins, Inc. of Vineland, NJ. Both bidders submitted responsive bids, and the apparent low bidder for Bid Item 1 (87 Octane Gasoline), Bid Item 2 (93 Octane Gasoline) and Bid Item 3 (B2 Bio-diesel) is Petroleum Traders Corporation. The margins and ranks for all received bids are provided in Table 1:

On behalf of Montgomery County Consortium of Communities, Upper Gwynedd Township solicited bids for the purchase of #2 heating oil for municipal operations through PennBID. The Township, which includes the golf course and Community Center, typically orders an estimated 11,000 gallons of heating oil for the Public Works garages, Bergey Mill, Heckler, Reiff & James Houses, and the Scout Cabin

This contract is bid, and awarded, based on a differential of the price bid versus an established index price for a given date for this commodity. I've attached the Notice of Award letter from Upper Gwynedd and the Contract to be executed by Lower Salford. As you can see from the letter, Wilson of Wallingford, Inc. was the only supplier that bid on this contract with a price differential of \$0.38/gallon over the posted average index price. these documents, the low bidder and awarded supplier for this contract is Petroleum Traders Corporation with the price differentials listed below.

Recent historical pricing (differential) is shown below.

<u>Year</u> <u>#2 Heating Oil</u> 2023 \$0.38/gal

No bids were received. Township contracted with a supplier after receiving 3 quotes.

The price differential was \$0.36/gallon.

Given the above, I would recommend that the Board affirm the award of the 2023 #2 Heating Oil Contract made by Upper Gwynedd Township to Wilson of Wallingford, Inc. and to enter into a contract directly with them for this service.

On behalf of four Montgomery County communities, Cheltenham Township put out a bid for the purchase of 30-gallon biodegradable leaf bags. The Township typically orders between 4,000 and 5,000 bags for sale to our residents.

The bid was posted on the PennBid website and only received interest from one (1) bidder, MID Hardware out of Philadelphia. The bid was tiered based on each municipality and their estimated needs. Lower Salford's price for an estimated 4,000 bags is \$0.5856/bag.

Recent historical pricing is shown below.

• 2022: \$0.755/bag * Spike in price was due to an anomaly in the bid specs.

• 2021: \$0.522/bag

• 2020: \$0.462/bag

Given the above, I would recommend that the Board affirm the award of the 2023 Biodegradable Paper Leaf Bag contract made by Cheltenham Township to MID Hardware.
